Who is eligible for support

Targeted support is available to working-age, pensioners in receipt of council tax support, and residents who are classed as severely mentally impaired for council tax purposes.

To support children and families, children who are eligible for Free School Meals.

Households with someone who is under 25 and classed as a care leaver.

The HSF is also being used to provide £300,000 to provide grants to a range of community and voluntary organisations.

Households	Form of support
Working age residents in receipt of Council Tax Support	£50 one-off payment
Households with someone who is under 25 and classed as a careleaver	£50 one-off payment
Residents who are classed as Severely Mentally Impaired for Council Tax purposes	£50 one-off payment
Pension age residents on Council Tax Support	£160 one-off payment
To support children and families, two payments to children eligible for Free School Meals.	£15 payment per pupil for May 2022 half term holidays £40 payment per pupil for the summer holidays (These payments were issued by schools)

Application process

There is no application process for the Spring Household Support Fund and payments have been automatically sent out to those that qualify using Council Tax data.

What is the maximum number of awards that can be given to a household?

One award per household, however a citizen could present at a VCSE organisation and receive a further payment from them.

When will I receive my support?

The majority of payments were made by BACS and Post Office Payout vouchers in mid-July for the working age group and Pension Households.

Free School meals provisions were issued by the schools prior to the end of terms.
